Authority
CLARITY defined:
The clarity of Scripture means that the Bible is written in such a way that its teachings are able to be understood by all who will read it seeking God's help and being willing to follow it. (Grudem)

maintaining spiritual i	ture means that the Bible is necessary for knowledge of the gospel, for life, and for certain knowledge of God's will, but is not necessary for sts or for knowing something about God's character and moral laws.

For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

1 Peter 2:15 (ESV) For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people.
Eph. 5:17 (ESV) Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

The Bible is NOT necessary for knowing that God or for knowing something about God's and moral laws.
Why? General revelation:
Psalm 19:1 (ESV)

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork.

Rom. 1:19-21 (ESV)

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse. For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

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SUFFICIENCY defined:

Scripture contained all the words of God he intended his people to have at each stage of redemptive history, and that it now contains everything we need God to tell us for salvation, for trusting him perfectly, and for obeying Him perfectly.

2 Tim. 3:14-15 (ESV)

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

Psalm 119:1-3 (ESV)

Blessed are those whose way is blameless, who walk in the law of the Lord Blessed are those who keep his testimonies, who seek him with their whole heart, who also do no wrong, but walk in his ways!

2 Tim. 3:16-17 (ESV)

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
