Students are meeting on campus every Wednesday night at 6pm in the Sanctuary for their midweek Bible study and worship time. Social distancing guidelines will be followed.

Was one of them "How Great Thou Art?" In terms of popularity, it's generally considered second only to "Amazing Grace".

It was originally written as a poem in the home of Carl Boberg, a member of the Swedish Parliament from 1912 to 1931. Its development into a song is a fascinating story. The song was known in several countries before it finally reached the shores of the United States where it achieved renown due first to George Beverly Shea and then later Elvis - who won two Grammy awards for his two versions of it.

Boberg said of the writing of his song, "It was in 1885, and in the time of year when everything seemed to be in its richest coloring; the birds were singing in trees and wherever they could find a perch. On a particular afternoon, some friends and I had been to Kronobäck where we had participated in an afternoon service. As we were returning a thunderstorm began to appear on the horizon. We hurried to shelter. There were loud claps of thunder, and the lighting flashed across the sky. Strong winds swept over the meadows and billowing fields of grain. However, the storm was soon over and the clear sky appeared with a beautiful rainbow. After reaching my home, I opened my window toward the sea. The church bells were playing the tune of a hymn. That same evening I wrote a poem which I titled, 'O Store Gud,' (How Great Thou Art)."

In today's message, **Take Heart**, we'll see both the greatness and goodness of Jesus our Savior King on display. He calms fearful hearts and he quiets troubled seas. He is both above all and in absolute control of all, while still being near us, with us, and available to us.

Whatever you are facing today, if you are in Christ, take heart. He has not forgotten you. He absolutely sees you. And His greatness and goodness will prevail for you good and God's glory!


