This week we make the turn in Mark's Gospel. Having declared to his disciples that he must suffer many things, be rejected, and be killed, Jesus now turns resolutely to his God-ordained fate in Jerusalem. He then tells his disciples that not only would he die, but that his followers must be willing to face death as well ("If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.")

But as he begins his walk to his final week, he gives an amazing gift to three of those disciples: He shows them his glory!

Yes – Jesus would soon face a horrific death on a cross. He was preparing them for the brutality that was coming. But the cross is not the end of the story. The cross leads to glory! Jesus told them that not only would he suffer, be rejected, and die, but that he would rise! After his resurrection, he would ascend where? To glory!

And so it will be with us – his followers. 1 Cor. 15:42-43 tells us, "So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power."

In his famous sermon "The Weight of Glory," C. S. Lewis says:

"The sense that in this universe we are treated as strangers, the longing to be acknowledged, to meet with some response, to bridge some chasm that yawns between us and reality, is part of our inconsolable secret. And surely from this point of view the promise of glory becomes highly relevant to our deepest desire. For glory means good [rapport] with God, acceptance by God, response, acknowledgment, and welcome into the heart of things. The door on which we have been knocking all our lives will open at last.... then our lifelong nostalgia, our longing to be reunited with something in the universe from which we now feel cut off, to be on the inside of some door which we have always seen from the outside, is no mere neurotic fancy but the truest index of our real situation.... At present we are on the outside of the world, the wrong side of the door.... but all the leaves of the New Testament are rustling with the rumor that it will not always be so. Some day, God willing, we shall get in."

I pray that today you will get a glimpse of God's glory in the face of Christ and that you will be renewed in the hope of future and everlasting glory for all who know and love Christ – all made possible because of the cross!
