One of the most influential and helpful Baptist confessions of faith is probably the New Hampshire Confession of 1833. In response to a rising tide of anti-missionary sentiment from hyper-Calvinists on one side and the growth of man-centered Pelagianism taught by influential revivalists like Charles Finney and the "free-will" influence of Benjamin Randall on the other side, the New Hampshire Confession served as a bridge to previous and long-held Baptist confessions and bridge that would unite Baptists who were not at either extreme.

On the subject of perseverance, The New Hampshire Confession states:

We believe that sanctification is the process by which according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness; that it is a progressive work; that it is begun in regeneration; and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, the Sealer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means- especially the Word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness, and prayer.

In our Calvary statement on "what we teach", we state that ...

"... all the redeemed, once saved, are kept by God's power and are thus secure in Christ forever (John 5:24; 6:37-40; 10:27-30; Romans 5:9-10; 8:1, 31-39; 1 Corinthians 1:4-8; Ephesians 4:30; Hebrews 7:25; 13:5; 1 Peter 1:5; Jude 24)."

So why the serious warning passages from scripture? Why Hebrews 6 and 10?

Aren't we told that we must persevere to the end to be saved? (Matthew 10:22, 24:13)

Aren't we challenged to not "give up?" (Galatians 6:9) Aren't we told that if we deny Him, he'll deny us? (2 Tim 2:12)

Aren't we warned that we will only be saved if we "hold firmly to the faith"? (1 Cor. 15:1-2)

Aren't we required to remain "steadfast" (James 5:11) and "hold fast" (Revelation 3:11) to be saved?

It's clear from these passages (and from our text last week in Hebrews 6:1-12) that we must persevere to the end to enjoy the promise and reward of our salvation. We must – as Eugene Peterson writes in The Message – "extend that same intensity toward a full-bodied hope, and keep at it till the finish", and "... stay the course with committed faith and then get everything promised ..."

We must persevere in our faith all the way to the end.

But in today's message, **The Anchor for Our Souls**, we'll consider the other side of perseverance – **God's**. We will see that our hope rests ultimately in God's promises, not our performance! And the person who counts most in the success of our salvation is not us, but Jesus Christ! Today we'll discover how He perseveres us! How awesome is that! What we need most – what is a non-negotiable essential to our salvation – is ultimately guaranteed by Christ Himself. We can have a "sure and steadfast hope for our souls" if that hope is anchored in Him!
