Today as we gather as the people of Calvary, we begin a new study about the heartbeat of our church. We believe that our calling is to be a family of **everyday missionaries** who make disciples.

As such a family, there are several key values that drive all that we do together. Over the next month, we'll delve into those 5 values – and the behaviors and habits those values necessarily create and sustain.

Today, we begin with the value of **community**.

In Analog Church: Why We Need Real People, Places, and Things in the Digital Age, author Jay Kim writes,

" ... Jesus and the New Testament writers make clear that those who profess Christ as Lord and Savior are not simply saved as isolated individuals but, most importantly, are saved *into* the community of God. As Joseph Hellerman writes, "In Scripture, salvation is a community-creating event." And this isn't just any sort of community - it's family.

Because we've so often read and hear the idea that Christians are "brothers and sisters, in Christ," we've lost sense of the radical reorientation that this idea commands. In the first-century world of the New Testament, the most important societal bond of marriage as the relationship that holds our primary allegiance. But this was not so during the time of Jesus. In the patriarchal system of the day, it was the blood relationship between siblings who shared the same father that was the most significant familial bond, over and above the contractual bond between spouses. In light of this, the fact that the New Testament writers address follower of Jesus as "brothers and sisters" more than a hundred times takes on added significance. Salvation draws us into a brand new family, one that replaces our previously held allegiances. In Christ, we become children of our one Father God, siblings bound by the blood of Jesus Himself...

... So it is with the family of God, the church. We are bound to one another. We did not *choose* it, we were *saved* into it. The only choice we have is how we will care for and cultivate this kinship."

For God's glory, for the good of those who need Him, and for our joy, may we be a true community of believers that lives as family and functions as ambassadors of God!
