## The Passover Lamb

Mark 14:10-25

**Context and contrast** ... From whole-hearted **devotion** to deep-seated **disdain** (Mary to Judas)

At the price of \_\_\_\_\_, Judas betrays the Christ.

*The great test of character:*

While Judas' actions were sovereignly decreed (Isa 53:10), he remains \_\_\_\_\_

Insights from the **First Passover ... Exodus 12**

The Jewish **Passover** (Seder):

**3 messages:**

- 1) Jesus himself – through His body – is the bread of “affliction” and “suffering”. He is our \_\_\_\_\_.

**What's missing** from this Passover meal?

*Isaiah 53:6-7*

Jesus didn't come to Jerusalem to \_\_\_\_\_ the Passover. He came to \_\_\_\_\_ the Passover.

*“Just as the first Passover was observed the night before God redeemed the Israelites from slavery through the blood of the lambs, this Passover meal was eaten the night before God redeemed the world from sin and death through the blood of Jesus.” – Tim Keller*

**Our Response:**

*Luke 22:19*

As an actual meal, the Passover must be \_\_\_\_\_. There is no benefit to a meal without \_\_\_\_\_ it. Likewise, it is not enough for us to know what Christ has done for us. We Must \_\_\_\_\_ by faith in order to benefit from his sacrifice!

The Passover (and our Communion) is a \_\_\_\_\_ meal. Through redemption, Christ has made for Himself a new people, bound not by similarities but by the \_\_\_\_\_. (See: Galatians 4:4-7)
