## Finding Religion, Missing Jesus

Mattnew 16:1-12
<b>The Sign</b> the Pharisees Refused to See  Matthew 16:1-4
The timing of their approach is suspect. Jesus has just performed another miraculous sign – feeding 4,000 people – and on the brink of yet another of His identity, His opponents arrive again.
They demand a <i>sign from heaven</i> —not because they lacked, but because they of what they had already seen. This was not an honest question. It was a trap, an attempt to entangle Jesus and refute his identity.
Jesus responds not with a sign, but with a:
"You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky, but you cannot interpret the signs of the times"

The "sign of the times" was nothing less than the appearance of the promised King and His Kingdom – The Messiah in their midst. And yet, they
Why?
Because they were not observers. Jesus calls them "evil and adulterous".
Evil, because He knew the real condition of their
<ul> <li>Adulterous, because though they claimed loyalty to the God of Israel, they were     to His purposes, more devoted to their traditions and power than to honoring and glorifying Him.</li> </ul>
And so Jesus refuses to give them another sign.
Instead, He offers one final, profound sign: "The sign of Jonah."
What was Jonah's 'sign'?
Jonah did not a sign. Jonah the sign!
Thru means God – in great mercy – <i>ensures</i> the delivery of a message of hope via thru a flawed prophet to an evil people.
Jonah's "resurrected" was the that he was God's prophet.
And now Jesus – a far prophet than Jonah – is here, and a self-righteous people to repent.

Using this encounter as a teachable moment, Jesus offers the disciples a warning:

Matthew 16:5-12

A recurring theme in the Gospels is the disciples' slowness to grasp the deeper meaning of Jesus' teachings. Here, they mistakenly think Jesus is talking about \_\_\_\_\_ bread, missing the \_ warning. Jesus rebukes their lack of faith, pointing them back to the miraculous feedings of the five thousand (Matthew 14:13-21) and the four thousand (Matthew 15:32-39).
